REOPENING PLANS FOR EMILIE UMC

From EUMC Leadership Team*

The leadership team of Emilie UMC has been holding frequent virtual meetings to discuss when it will be safe to reopen the building, to hold in-person worship &/or meetings, what will be required when we do reopen, and what changes will need to be made to "normal" building operations. We thank you for your patience and understanding as the national, state and county agencies work to implement plans to move to the next phase of the pandemic.

At the virtual meeting held Wednesday, May 20th, Emilie's leadership team unanimously agreed NOT to reopen the building immediately when the county reaches phase YELLOW in the coming weeks. The committee will continue to work closely with the Day School and may allow the building to be open for the Day School to provide care to families within the community before the church is able to gather in person. We have also contacted the leaders of Head Start and will evaluate their proposed plans once we receive them.

The decision to delay reopening of public worship and activities is based on 3 key elements: safety, quality, and children.

1. Safety for everyone
 - A. Due to current demand, items needed to clean and sanitize the church regularly are still unavailable.
 - B. Plans for restrooms, welcome center, sanctuary set-up need to be outlined.
2. Quality of worship experience (based on CDC and EPA Conference guidelines)
 - A. limit of gathering size of 25 or less
 - B. restriction of no singing
 - C. maintaining social distancing in worship and when entering/exiting the building
3. What do we do with the children?
 - A. The CDC and other childcare agencies have put together specific guidelines for schools and childcare organizations.
 - B. Those guidelines will be incredibly challenging to implement with in-person worship.

These factors would make it impossible to hold a safe in-person worship at this time.

The committee will continue to meet weekly (via Zoom) for thoughtful and careful planning of new building procedures and safety standards. Staff will continue to provide an online worship service Sunday morning at 9:30 AM (via the church Facebook page), as well as a mid-week message from Pastor Mike, Chapel for the children, and other spiritual resources. Please reach out to Pastor Mike or any of the church staff members if you or your family have any physical needs or prayer requests, so that we can continue to be the Church and support the church body in whatever ways we can.

Our sincere desire is to be together in face-to-face fellowship within the doors of Emilie UMC as soon as it is safe to do so. Until then we pray health and safety for all.

Message from Pastor Mike

Assurance

In recent days, my thoughts perhaps more than usual have been on heaven. Perhaps because of the Pandemic, or the daily news reports of people seemingly on the verge of panic because of isolation and worry. There are some people who depend so much on their reason that they reason away God. They say, "God is not a person we can ever see." They say, "God is a Spirit." So He is, but He is a person too; and became a man and walked the earth once. Scripture tells us very plainly that God has a dwelling-place. There is no doubt about the existence of heaven, we see and dwell with Him.

In 1 Kings 8:30, we read:

"And hearken Thou to the supplication of Thy servant, and of Thy people Israel, when they shall pray toward this place; and hear Thou in heaven Thy dwelling-place; and when Thou hearest, forgive."

This idea that heaven is everywhere and nowhere is not true according to Scripture. Heaven is God's habitation, and when Christ came to earth, He taught us to pray: "Our Father, which art in heaven." This habitation is spoken of as "the city of eternal life." Think of a city without a cemetery there is no dying there. If there could be such a city on this earth what a rush, to go there! Think of a city through whose streets has no flow of business, where no hearses exist; a city without griefs or graves, without sins or sorrows, without marriages or mourning, without births or burials; a city which glories in having Jesus for its King, angels for its guards, and whose citizens are saints!

More than melancholy, boredom, or weariness; these days more than ever should alert us to the hope and assurance of our future home.
